To raise much needed funds and awareness for Red Nose Australia, 8 female rowers and their amazing team will take off in an attempt to cross the treacherous Bass Strait in a traditional surf boat, and we need your help!

#### **ABOUT RED NOSE**

Red Nose is Australia's leading authority on safe sleep and safer pregnancy advice, as well as bereavement support for anyone affected by the loss of a pregnancy or death of a baby or child.

Since 1977, their determination and tireless fundraising efforts created one of Australia's most successful public health programs – "Back to Sleep", which has so far resulted in an 80% reduction in SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome) in Australia.

However, 3,000 babies and young children still die suddenly and unexpectedly each year in Australia, and 1 in 4 pregnancies end in miscarriage.

Red Nose has just launched the Red Nose Research Accelerator Fund, an initiative that will ensure new research projects are funded every single year, accelerating the next generation of research and unlocking the answers we desperately need to help save little lives.

By supporting the Red Nose MusselRowers, you will be helping to invest funds into research projects that could discover the next crucial breakthrough in SIDS and stillbirth research.

'We will be chomping at the bit to get going once February rolls around. We know it will be hard, but Red Nose achieve amazing results, and our hard work will be worth it to be able to support their mission' said Michelle Cottington, one of the 'oar-some' MusselRowers.

#### **ABOUT THE CHALLENGE**


On 12 February, 2023, a group of 8 female rowers and their crew are setting off to cross one of the most treacherous bodies of water in Australia - the Bass Strait.

The trip will take 6 full days of rowing, ranging from 40 to 70 km per day (total of 320 km) in very challenging conditions. The team will camp on small islands dotting the eastern limit of the Strait along the way.

A similar challenge was undertaken 12 months ago by a male crew - the original MusselRowers. They have passed the mantle to the all-female crew of rowers who are undergoing a tremendous fundraising effort for Red Nose, and keeping the MusselRowers' legacy strong.

### What your sponsorship will get you...

All sponsors will receive regular media coverage and be listed on our social media pages, as well as being mentioned by name on Red Nose press releases.

\$1 per km = name on group sticker on boat

\$2 per km = Individual 200mm x 75mm sticker on boat

\$3 per km = Individual 300mm x 100mm sticker on boat

\$5 per km = Individual 350mm x 125mm sticker on both sides of boat

\$2,000 = Individual 400mm x 150mm sticker on both sides of boat

\$5,000 = Individual 600mm x 200mm sticker on both sides of boat
